Medical Education/Evaluation Committee (ME2)

Co-Curricular Program Student Guidelines

ME2 gives students the opportunity to become involved in medical education beyond their traditional role as a consumer. By evaluating course content, lecturers, notes, labs and exams, student interact with faculty and fellow students to provide feedback and aid in future course development. Students are encouraged to become knowledgeable about issues affecting medical education and to participate in activities such as Journal Club, which spotlights educational articles that focus on current and future trends.

Year I ME2 Students - Students activities August thru April 30th

1. All students will conduct a minimum of three course focus groups.
2. All students must observe the first Year II focus group.
3. All students not leading or co-leading a course focus group will be required to participate in all the Year I focus groups.
4. All students will be required to complete an approved educational research project.
5. All students must attend a minimum of four Academic and Student Programs Journal Club meetings. The Journal Club is held the last Thursday of each month from 12:00 to 1:00.
6. Duties as assigned by the Associate Dean for Undergraduate Medical Education..

Year II ME2 Students - Students activities August thru April 30th

1. All students will conduct a minimum of three course focus groups.
2. All students not leading or co-leading a course focus group will be required to participate in all Year II focus groups.
3. All students that are taking the ME2 for the first time and do not have focus group moderator experience will be required to observe a focus group conducted by a Year II student prior to their first group.
4. All students will be required to complete an approved education research project.
5. All students must attend a minimum of four Academic and Student Programs Journal Club. The Journal Club is held the last Thursday of each month from 12:00 to 1:00.
6. Duties as assigned by the Associate Dean for Undergraduate Medical Education..
