Applicants should be board certified or eligible (preferred) or enrolled and completed three years in an accredited general surgery residency. To apply, forward a letter of intent, cv, references and three letters of recommendation (including from current or most recent Program Director).

Rotations

The primary clinical training will be based in the adult surgical intensive care units at Harper Hospital (approx. 20 beds, focused on general surgery, cardiothoracic surgery, vascular surgery and other surgical subspecialties) and Detroit Receiving Hospital (approx 12 beds, focused on trauma and general surgery). Elective experiences (2 months) in neurointensive ICU, adult burn unit, pediatric SICU, pediatric ECMO, hyperbaric therapy, interventional radiology, and nephrology are available. A direct operative experience of trauma and critically ill patients, limited as per ACGME guidelines, is available for interested fellows. Opportunities for research and scholarly activities are available.

Faculty support comprises six surgical critical care faculty and two anesthesia critical care faculty.
